# **BritInn Fellowship Programme - INCOMING**

The BritInn Fellowship Programme supports outstanding scholars across all disciplines and addresses especially early career researchers. It provides funding for short-term stays at the University of Innsbruck to promote joint research projects between researchers from Britain and Austria.

BritInn Fellows devote their time in Innsbruck to research with the aim of launching new joint projects with colleagues at the University of Innsbruck. The fellowship covers (part of) their travel and/or accommodation expenses for up to two weeks during the winter or summer semester (lecture period) at the University of Innsbruck.

Applications should be submitted to BritInn via a member of the academic staff from the University of Innsbruck who will host the BritInn fellow at their department and collaborate with them during their fellowship.

The programme does not support, as a primary activity, off-site research. During their stay at the University of Innsbruck, all BritInn Fellows are expected to give a public guest lecture connected to their research. This lecture is organised by BritInn in cooperation with the hosting department.

The fellowships are designed to promote academic exchange between outstanding scholars from universities and research institutions in Great Britain and the University of Innsbruck, and to strengthen science communication through public lectures presented by BritInn Fellows.

#### **Eligibility Criteria:**

- Completed Doctorate/PhD
- Employment at a university or research institution in Great Britain
- Outstanding track-record of academic achievements
- Time of stay: during the regular semester at the University of Innsbruck
- Guest Lecture about the research of the BritInn Fellow
- Length of stay: up to two weeks
- To receive reimbursement: a short report about the stay after completion (details will be given after approval)

- CV and list of publications
- Outline of joint research project between the incoming BritInn Fellow and the host department
- Outline/abstract for the public guest lecture (max. 100 words), including title and a short bio (max. 50 words).
